### What You'll Learn

- The heritage of stained glass art and notable glass artists.
- Safety practices
- Tools, equipment, and nomenclature
- Glass art skills, Cutting, Fitting, Grinding, Foiling, Soldering.
- Types and characteristics of various types of glass
- Advice on designing your own projects

### Duration

Workshops are conducted in a single 5-hour session and limited to FOUR participants.

### Format

This is a hands-on learning experience taught using demonstration, practice, and discussion. A large portion of your time will be spent practicing with tools in hand. You'll be able to complete a project during the workshop and your instructor may schedule open studio hours.

### Location

This class is held upstairs at the Hollis-McRitchie Museum and is hosted by the Newnan-Coweta Historical Society. The address is 74 Jackson Street, Newnan, GA.

### Student Requirements

No prior stained glass experience is required.

### What to Bring

Bring appropriate eye protection. It's required at all times when working with glass. All other materials, tools and equipment use is included in the cost. Bring your own ideas and questions to discuss. Participants receive a sourcebook that outlines the topics covered and includes references and sources for more information.

### Cost

Workshop cost is \$60 per participant.

### Other Information

Note-taking is encouraged and recommended.
